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School Overview

Mastery Schools Australia (MSA) is an independent specialist school established to provide a high-quality educational alternative for young people who are disengaged from their current schooling environment. Our schools focus on supporting students during the middle years of education, a critical stage where many young people experience challenges with engagement, learning confidence and academic progress.

Since opening our first campus in Queensland in 2021, MSA has continued to expand its reach to support more students who benefit from a structured, supportive and evidence-informed learning environment. In 2025, Mastery Schools Australia operated campuses in 6 Queensland locations, with a new campus approved in Launceston, Tasmania and Sydney Olympic Park, New South Wales scheduled to open in 2026.

Across all campuses, MSA is committed to strengthening students' academic foundations while also developing the resilience, confidence and learning habits needed for long-term success.

Through evidence-based teaching practices, personalised support and high expectations for both students and staff, our schools aim to help students reconnect with education and achieve meaningful academic and personal growth.

Reconciliation Action Plan



In 2025, Mastery Schools Australia reached an important milestone with the formal launch of its Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP), marking a significant step in strengthening our commitment to creating culturally safe, inclusive and respectful learning environments across all school communities.

The RAP was formally recognised through a dedicated launch event, bringing together staff and members of the school community to acknowledge the importance of reconciliation and our shared responsibility in embedding its principles into everyday practice.

Our RAP was developed by a dedicated working group, and it outlines a series of meaningful actions across the areas of relationships, respect and opportunities. These actions focus on strengthening cultural responsiveness among staff, embedding Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander perspectives into teaching and learning, and building respectful and ongoing relationships with local communities.

The RAP also supports the continued delivery of high-quality educational experiences by ensuring that teaching practices and school environments reflect and respect the diverse cultural backgrounds of students.

Looking ahead, the implementation of the RAP will play an important role in supporting the organisation's 2026 strategic priorities, including increasing the enrolment, engagement and educational success of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students across our school communities.

Mastery Schools Australia remains committed to continuing this work, recognising that reconciliation is an ongoing journey that requires reflection, learning and meaningful action over time.





Community and Event Highlights



Enrolment and Attendance Data

In 2025, Mastery Schools Australia supported a total of 961 students across its campuses, with enrolments distributed across Years 4 to 10. The largest student cohorts were in Years 6 and 7, reflecting strong demand for support during the middle years of schooling.

Enrolment numbers varied across campuses, with Springfield, Varsity Lakes and Southport representing the largest school communities. This distribution reflects both campus capacity and local demand across regions.

Average student attendance across campuses ranged from 78% to 87% during the reporting period. These figures reflect the diverse needs of the student cohort, including students who have previously experienced challenges with school engagement and attendance.

School teams continue to implement targeted support strategies, including Attendance Support Plans, to support students in re-engaging with education in a structured way. Strengthening student attendance and engagement will remain an ongoing focus across all campuses in 2026.

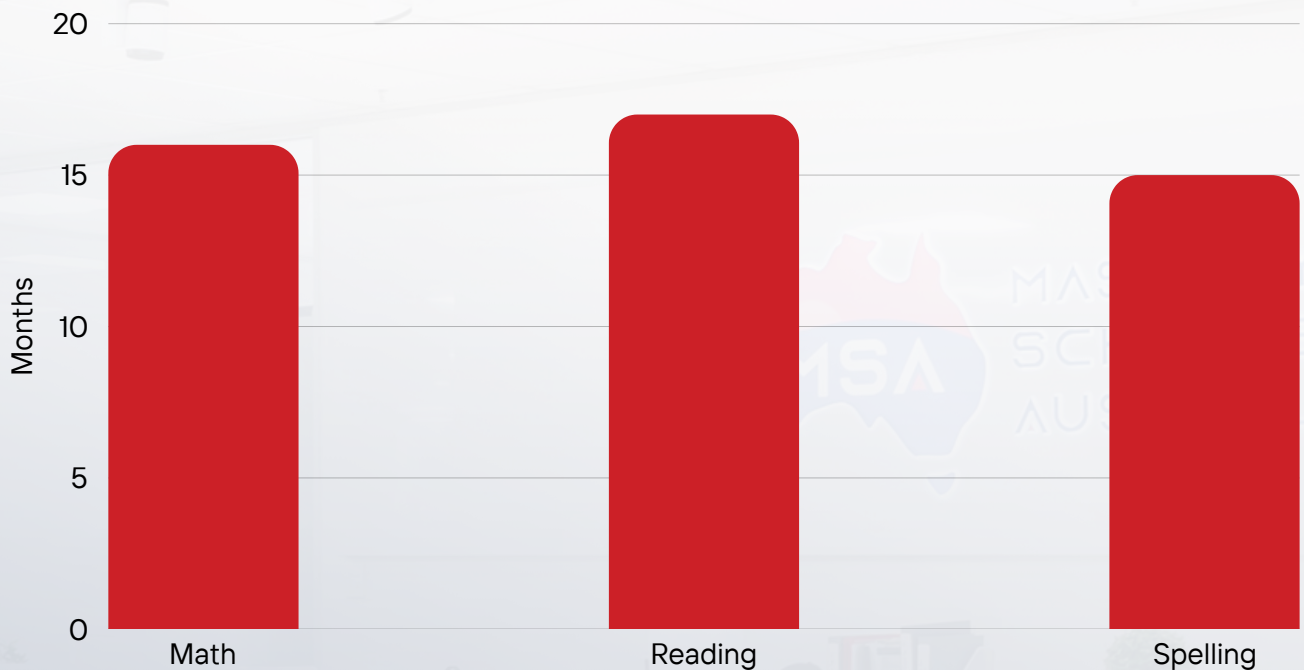
Characteristics of the Student Body

Mastery Schools Australia provides an alternative education pathway for students who struggle academically and need extra support to learn. This could be due to social, emotional or behavioural challenges. The School prides itself on the innovative approach to education, which supports the needs of students with diverse learning difficulties and disabilities.

In 2025, approximately 90% of students were classified as meeting the criteria of Students with a Disability through the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD). Students must show a desire to attend MSA at their interview to be granted enrolment. The desire to overcome obstacles to gaining an education is a common characteristic of the student body at MSA.

Approximately 8% of the students in 2025 identified as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander.

Student Learning Outcomes

Throughout 2025, students across Mastery Schools Australia demonstrated strong progress in core academic areas including mathematics, reading and spelling.

Standardised assessment data indicates that, on average, students achieved approximately **15–17 months of learning growth within a 12-month period**. This level of progress reflects accelerated learning when compared with typical age-expected development.

In addition to improvements in age-equivalent scores, students also demonstrated positive movement relative to same-age peers. Standard score improvements across all assessed areas indicate that many students are gradually closing gaps in achievement while strengthening their core academic skills.

These results are based on nationally norm-referenced assessments and reflect average testing intervals of approximately **eight to nine months** between assessment points. Results have been annualised to allow fair comparison of student growth across different testing periods.

Note on assessment data:

Student growth data is derived from standardised, norm-referenced assessments in mathematics (KeyMath-3), reading (TOWRE-2) and spelling (TWS). Age-equivalent growth reflects the change in learning level between testing points, while normalised growth adjusts results to a 12-month rate to allow fair comparison where test intervals differ.

Staffing Overview



Mastery Schools Australia is committed to maintaining a highly qualified and capable workforce to support student learning and wellbeing. All teaching staff hold current Queensland College of Teachers registrations and participate in ongoing professional development aligned with school priorities. Non-teaching staff are also appropriately qualified for their roles, hold relevant Blue Card clearances, and participate in professional development relevant to their responsibilities.

Professional Learning and Teacher Development



Mastery Schools Australia places a strong emphasis on the development of its educators, recognising that high-quality teaching is the most significant driver of improved student outcomes.

In 2025, MSA invested \$3.7 million in staff professional learning and development. This reflects a deliberate and sustained focus on building teacher capability through structured, ongoing and evidence-based training.

Unlike many schools, where professional development is delivered externally on an ad hoc basis, MSA delivers the majority of its training internally through the Science of Learning Education Centre (SoLEC). SoLEC is an in-house professional learning program designed specifically for MSA's teaching model, grounded in the Science of Learning and a structured, explicit approach to teaching. This ensures professional learning is consistent, practical and directly aligned to the needs of students.

Through SoLEC, educators participate in regular training focused on evidence-based practices, including the Science of Learning and Direct Instruction. These sessions are led by the Executive Director of Education and experienced Executive Teachers, with staff coming together across campuses to participate in shared professional learning throughout the year. This approach supports consistency in teaching practice while strengthening collaboration across the organisation.

MSA also invests in the development of its instructional leaders. Instructional coaches and executive teaching staff undertake advanced training, including international programs such as those delivered by the National Institute for Direct Instruction (NIFDI). This expertise is then embedded across all campuses, ensuring strong alignment between training, coaching and classroom practice.

This internal approach to professional learning ensures training is continuous, practical and closely connected to day-to-day teaching. It also enables MSA to maintain consistency across campuses while remaining responsive to the needs of individual students and school communities.

The impact of this investment is reflected in the quality of teaching across the organisation and the strong student growth demonstrated across campuses. By developing highly skilled educators, MSA continues to deliver structured, supportive and high-impact learning environments that strengthen student engagement, confidence and academic success.

Governance and Compliance

Mastery Schools Australia is committed to maintaining strong governance, regulatory compliance, and high standards of accountability across the organisation.

Throughout 2025, Mastery Schools Australia operated in accordance with the legislative and regulatory requirements of Queensland, including the expectations of the Non-State Schools Accreditation Board (NSSAB). The organisation supports the implementation of robust governance frameworks, policies and operational procedures designed to ensure effective oversight and responsible financial management.

The expansion of the Mastery Schools Australia corporate team during the year enabled further refinement of the organisation's governance and compliance frameworks. This has supported a stronger focus on enhancing policies, strengthening oversight processes and ensuring consistent operational standards across schools.

Work also commenced on the development of a national Child Safety Framework and a national Compliance Framework to further support governance, accountability and best practice across the Mastery Schools network. These frameworks will be progressively implemented during 2026.

Mastery Schools Australia remains firmly committed to promoting and maintaining a strong culture of child safety across all school communities. Policies, procedures and training programs are implemented to ensure that child safety remains a central priority in all areas of school operations.

The organisation maintains a comprehensive suite of policies and procedures that support regulatory compliance, operational governance, financial management and the delivery of high-quality educational environments. These policies are regularly reviewed to ensure they remain aligned with current legislative requirements and best practice.

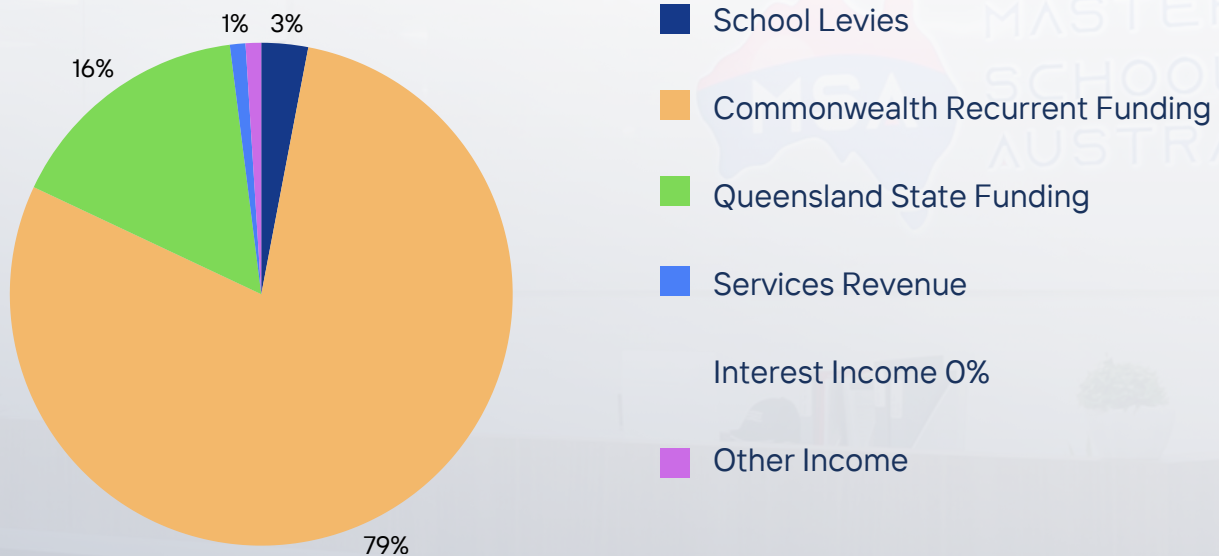
The Board remains committed to maintaining strong governance and compliance frameworks that support the continued growth and development of Mastery Schools Australia.

Financial Summary



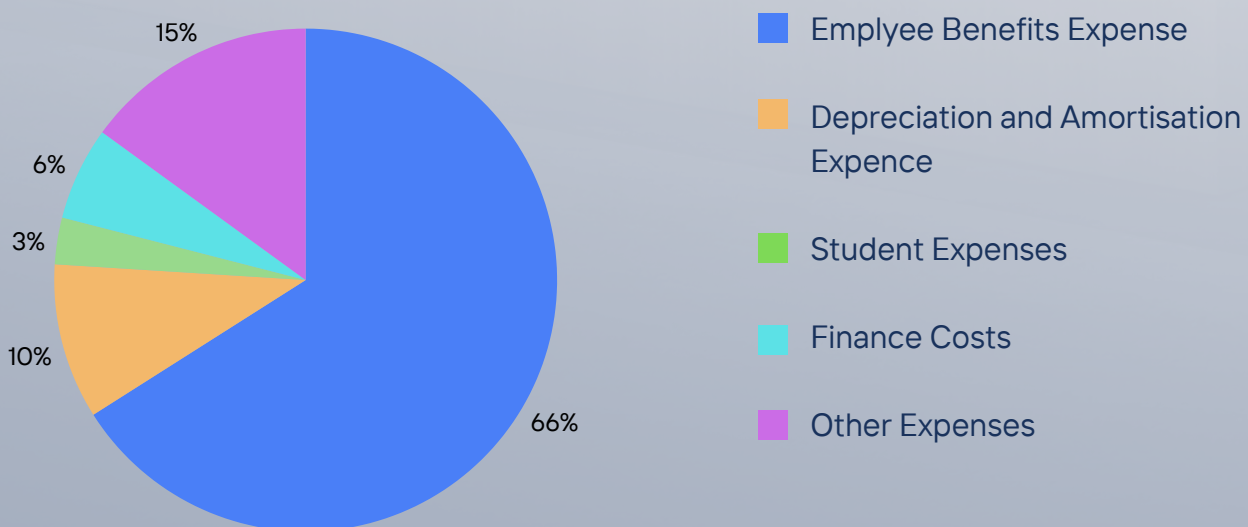
Mastery Schools Australia recorded total income of \$37.7 million in 2025, with the majority of funding derived from Commonwealth recurrent funding (79%), supplemented by Queensland Government funding (16%) and school levies (3%).

2025 Income Split



Total expenditure for the year was \$31.9 million. The largest proportion of expenditure was allocated to employee benefits (66%), followed by other operational expenses (15%), depreciation and amortisation (10%) and finance costs (6%).

This financial profile reflects the ongoing investment in staffing, infrastructure and operational capacity required to support student learning and the continued growth of the Mastery Schools network.

Future Directions and Strategic Priorities

In 2026, Mastery Schools Australia will continue to strengthen its operations, support student outcomes and enhance consistency across its growing network of schools. Key strategic priorities are aligned to the organisation's four focus domains:

Student Achievement and Growth

Mastery Schools Australia will continue to strengthen student outcomes through the consistent delivery of evidence-based teaching practices, including the Science of Learning and Direct Instruction approaches. A continued focus on teacher capability, data-informed practice and targeted support will ensure students experience measurable academic growth, improved engagement and increased confidence in learning.

Child Safety and Wellbeing

A key priority is ensuring that every student is supported within a safe, inclusive and structured learning environment. This includes the implementation of a National Child Safety Framework, strengthening staff training and accountability, and embedding consistent practices that support student wellbeing, safety and respectful behaviour across all campuses.

People and Systems

The organisation will continue to invest in building a capable and values-aligned workforce through structured coaching and professional learning, including through the Science of Learning Education Centre (SoLEC). This will be supported by the ongoing development of efficient systems and processes, including the continued implementation of EDGE (Student Management System), to reduce administrative burden and support consistent, high-quality practice across schools.

Sustainable Growth & Partnerships

Mastery Schools Australia will continue to expand in a strategic and sustainable manner, ensuring that all new campuses reflect the integrity of the MSA model. This includes strengthening community partnerships, building brand awareness and maintaining strong financial and governance practices to support long-term viability.

Monitoring & Accountability

Progress against these priorities will be monitored through regular reporting to the Board, including termly performance updates, compliance checks and ongoing strategic plan reviews. This approach ensures accountability, supports continuous improvement and maintains a strong focus on delivering outcomes for students.
